31st Hall of Fame Awards

SEVEN TO BE INDUCTED AT HALL OF FAME'S 31ST ANNIVERSARY ON NOV. 19

Seven graduates will be inducted into the 31st annual *East Haven High School Alumni Association's Hall of Fame* on Sunday, Nov. 19, 2017 at the Country House Restaurant, East Haven. Slated for induction are: **David Augustine**, '68; **Judge Gary Gambardella**, '79; **Laurie Kickosicki**, '85; **Ezra "Buddy" Goodwin**, '86; **Thomas "T.J." Lavery**, '98; **Paul Cicarella**, '02; and **Jessica Moriarty**, '07.

David Augustine earned a bachelor's degree in English and Secondary Education from Sacred Heart University (SHU) and a master's degree in Remedial Reading from SCSU. He was an NCAA Division II golfer on the SHU golf team from 1969-1972, serving as captain during his senior year. In 1972, he began his career at EHHS, teaching for 35 years before retiring. He was appointed head coach of the golf team in 1977, a position he has held for 40 years. During his tenure, his teams won five divisional championships and, in 1989, the Housatonic League Tournament Championship. One of his golfers was the individual champion of the Housatonic League; two players went on to become PGA professionals; and one is presently in PGA Golf School. In 2010, he was named *New Haven Register* "Golf Coach of the Year." The *East Haven Courier* recognized him as a "Sportsperson of the Week" in 2005 and 2010, and as a "Person of the Week" in 2007. The SCC named him Division II "Golf Coach of the Year" in 2014. He has been a professional musician for 40 years and also plays guitar for his church group. David and his wife Kathleen live in Branford; they have two children and two grandchildren.

Judge Gary Gambardella earned a bachelor's degree in 1983 from the University of Connecticut and a J.D. in 1987 from Western New England University School of Law, where he served as president of the Student Bar Association. After a judicial clerkship, he embarked on a career as a prosecutor in Bucks County, Penn. From 1988 to 2010, he successfully prosecuted some of the county's most dangerous and notorious criminals. He litigated over 100 jury trials. He also oversaw Bucks County's forfeiture program and successfully litigated the first jury trial under Pennsylvania's drug forfeiture law. During his tenure, over \$10 million of ill-gotten gains were forfeited. In 2003, he was elected president of the Bucks County Bar Association, the first and only sitting prosecutor to serve as president since the association's establishment in 1853. During his term, he initiated a program to provide free legal services to Bucks County military families. Gary also served as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney under "Project Safe Neighborhoods," President G.W. Bush's national initiative to reduce gun violence, and served briefly as Bucks County's alternate member to the federal Anti-Terrorism Task Force. He passed the bar exams of Connecticut, Pennsylvania and Washington and has been admitted to practice before two Federal Courts. In 2011, he was elected a district judge in Bucks County. In his 2017 re-election bid, he won both the Republican and Democratic primaries. Gary lives in Plumstead Township, Bucks County, Penn. with his wife Bobbi. They have two sons, Andrew and Glenn.

Laurie Kikosicki earned a bachelor's degree at Western Connecticut State University and began her career at U.S. Surgical as a Product Marketing information specialist, eventually becoming manager of Creative Services. Tyco Healthcare named her manager of Product Labeling. She later moved to Covidien, first as manager and later director of Graphic Design Services. She currently is director of Graphic Design Services at Medtronic. She serves on the EHHS 1985 Reunion Committee. Since 2002, she has volunteered with EH Youth Soccer, currently serving as a board member and clinic coordinator. She was a member of St. Vincent's School Board for 10 years, and received the school's "Distinguished Graduate Award." She is active in her parish, serving as Eucharistic minister and Carnival and Midnight Run volunteer. She supports the East Haven Food Pantry and Connecticut Food Bank (CFB); is a member of the Yellow Jacket Club, and helps run the EHHS Girls Soccer Annual Alumni Game and American Heart Association fundraiser. She volunteers for WLA & Covidien Cares' Annual Christmas Food & Gift Drive, which supports local non-profits, including CFB and Christian Community Action. She and her husband Joseph ('85) live in East Haven and have three daughters: Kristin ('13), Megan ('16) and Jordan ('18).

Ezra "Buddy" Goodwin was a stand-out basketball player at EHHS. During his senior year, he was named to the All-Housatonic Basketball Team. On Jan. 19 of that year, he set the school's single-game scoring record of 50 points, sinking 18 field goals and 14 free throws. He averaged 22.6 points per game during his senior year, and ended his career with 815 points. He attended South Central Community College in New Haven (1987-88); King College, Bristol, Tenn., (1988-89); and Housatonic Community College in Bridgeport (1990-92), where he averaged 38.7 points per game and was second in scoring among New England community colleges. Buddy has served the City of New Haven as a professional firefighter since 2002 and received a Life Safety Award for saving a fellow firefighter.

Thomas "T.J." Lavery was a three-sport athlete at EHHS, playing football and basketball for four years. He also competed in track and field for two years. During his junior year, the football team posted an 8-3 season, and he led in receptions and receiving yards. During his football career, he posted 64 receptions; 887 all-purpose yards; 1,178 receiving yards and 568 kick-off return yards, both school records. He also returned two kickoffs for TDs, had four games with more than 100 yards, and was named to All-State in his senior year. He was named All-SCC in his junior and senior years and to the *Hartford Courant* All-State First Team in his senior year. He represented the Easties as a member of the South Squad in the Hall of Fame Game. He continued his academic and football careers at UConn, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Political Science. T.J. returned to East Haven, where he pursued a career in inside sales.

Paul Cicarella was a four-year letterman in wrestling and, as a junior, was SCC Champ at 140 pounds. During his senior year at EHHS, he was the State Class L wrestling champion in the 145-pound class; placed fourth in the State Open; and achieved a 41-2 season record. He ended his high school career with an overall regular season record of 117-22. He broke East Haven High School records for most takedowns in a single season, most career takedowns, most wins in a single season, most consecutive wins and most career wins. He was named *New Haven Register* All-Area in his junior and senior years and All-State in his senior year. He wrestled one year at Springfield Community College and then pursued a career in law enforcement, working for the State of Connecticut, as well as his own firm, Advanced Investigations LLC. He served as Easties' head wrestling coach from 2006 to 2014. Paul lives in North Haven with his wife Christy and their two children, Giada and Paul III.

Jessica Moriarty captained the girls' basketball team as a junior and senior. During her career, she scored 853 points; 432 rebounds; 363 assists, a school record; and 196 steals. She was named All-SCC (sophomore, junior and senior); Team MVP (junior and senior); to the New Haven Tap-Off Club All-County Team (senior); and the All-Oronoque, All-Area, All-County, and All-State Teams. In track and field, she was part of the record-breaking 4x400 relay, and set a shotput record of 33', 11.75". She earned a bachelor's degree from Eastern Connecticut State University, where she played basketball, serving as co-captain in 2010 and 2011. She was named to the All-Rookie Team (2008) and as Little East Conference (LEC) Defensive Player of the Year (2009, 2010). She was named to the LEC All Defensive Team (2009-2011); First Team All-Little East Conference/New England Alliance and the Eastern Tip-Off All-Tournament Team (2010, 2011). At ECSU, she scored 1,115 career points and 335 assists. She was recognized as a Scholar Athlete (2010, 2011). She later earned a master's degree (magna cum laude) from SCSU. She is in her seventh year as a health and physical education instructor in the West Haven Public Schools, where she earned the Unsung Hero Award for teaching. She also served as EHHS JV girls' basketball coach (2011-2013); during which time she received the IAABO Board #10 Henry "Hank" Luzzi Sportsmanship Award (2011-2012). She has served as the West Haven High School girls' varsity basketball coach since 2013 and, in addition, coaches for the CBA AAU program.

1955 -The Easties won their fifth Housatonic League Football Championship with a season record of 6-1-1.

1959 - Theresa M. Zampiello was named *New Haven Register* “Youth of the Year,” and the Easties won their seventh Housatonic League Football Championship, finishing the season with a record of 8-1.

1963 - Dennis Anderson was named to the All-Housatonic Football Team.

1968 - Jim Pascarella and Jean Pesce received the All-Around Boy & Girl Awards.

1970 - James A. Miessau was named *New Haven Register* “Youth of the Year” and a scholar-athlete by the New Haven Chapter of the National Football Foundation. Also, George Rose was named to the All-Housatonic Football Team.

1973 – Terry Stratton received the DAR Award and was named valedictorian of the graduating class.

1976 - Bill Parker, Pete Costa, Sal Garitta and Mike Tullo were named to the All-Housatonic Football Team. Also, the Drama Club performed Neil Simon’s “Barefoot in the Park.”

1978 - Sue Badamo set track records in the 880, the mile and the mile relay. Also, the senior class dedicated the Pioneer yearbook to Steve Narracci, Physical Education teacher. School athletic records were set by freshman Amy Baum in the 50-yard freestyle; Diane West in the 200-yard individual medley and 100-yard backstroke; Susan Finer in the 100-yard breaststroke; and West, Baum, Margaret Walker and Mary Beth Coyle in the 400-yard freestyle relay. Finally, Michael Luzzi was the first sophomore to be named *New Haven Register* “Player of the Week.”

1982 - Wayne Quattlebaum and Mike DeRose were named to the All-Housatonic Track Team, and Robert V. Albis was named *New Haven Register* “Youth of the Year.”

1993 - Tom Lacroix was named to the All-State Swim Team for the second time.

1999 - James Glee was named to the All-State Football Team.

2007 - Nicholas Child was named a Scholar Athlete by the New Haven Chapter of the National Football Foundation.

2008 - Salvatore Salemme was named *New Haven Register* “Youth of the Year.”

Alumni Scholarships are awarded to the highest ranking students in the senior class whose parents or grandparents were graduates of East Haven High School. The 2017 recipients are **Joshua Palmer, Rachel Amatruda, Jesse Ludington** and **Daniel McCarthy**.

Palmer, son of Glenn Palmer ('83), was vice president of the senior class and a member of the National Honor Society, the marching band, SADD and the Math League. He received the Rensselaer Medal, Rochester Institute of Technology Bausch and Lomb Honorary Science Award, geometry honors, pre-calculus honors, Principles of Engineering, AP US Government Award, and the Yale Book Award. He was a varsity letter-winner in golf and was a volunteer in his church group, as well as the East Haven Food Pantry, Travelers Golf Tournament, St. Therese Carnival and the Winter Guard Show. He was ranked second in the senior class and is now attending Yale University, majoring in Engineering.

Amatruda, daughter of David Amatruda ('84), was the captain and a four-year member of the Pom Pom Squad and a 15-year member of the Center Stage Dance Academy. She received the Amgen Biology Award, the Wellesley College Book Award, and the SCC Scholar Leader Award and was a member of the National Honor Society. Tamara Highsmith Akanno '04 is an IT consultant at Slalom Consulting.

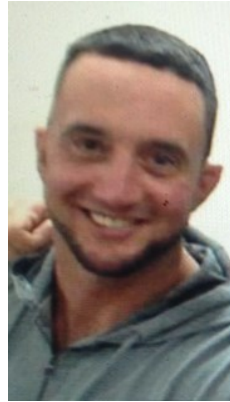

On March 9, she placed fourth in the weight throw at the NCAA Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships with a toss of 65'-7", her personal best and a new school record, as she claimed All-American honors for the second time in her SCSU career.
